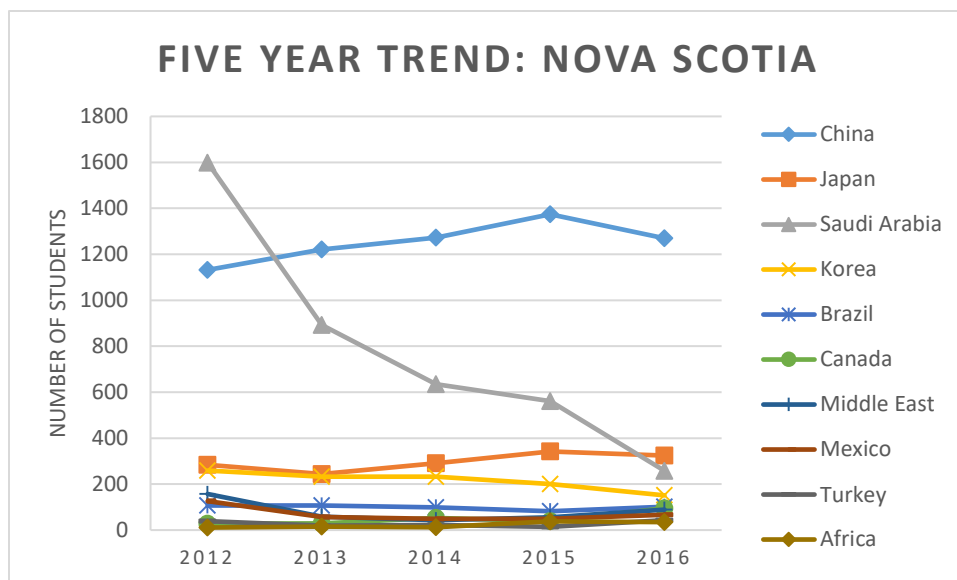




Languages Canada Fact Sheet 2017

Top Source Markets



More than any other province, Nova Scotia has been affected by changes in overseas government scholarship programs, for example the King Abdullah Scholarship Program.

Beginning in 2015, members in the province began working to diversify their student populations.

Key Statistics

- **2,902** students in 2016
- **3** public sector, **7** private sector members
- **\$42.5 million/yr** in export income
- **188** employees (full- and part-time)
- **1,255** students in pathway programs, destined for further education in Canada
- **60%** of students hold Study Permits

Language students in Nova Scotia stay an average of 15.6 weeks each.

This is the longest average stay of any province.
