Federal Advocacy

- Engagement with Ministers Mendicino, Blair, Joly, Hadju, PMO, and senior government officials
- Coordinated efforts with the Coalition of Hardest Hit Businesses and other national associations
- Impactful, data-driven messaging (Kunin study concluded our sector enabled \$6.7 billion in export revenues and 75,000 in 2019!)
- Federal election year

Federal Advocacy Priorities and Successes

- Easing of Canada's entry requirements and cost for international students, supported by safe corridors
- Access to federal relief and stimulus funding for LC members – CEWS, CERS programs; Tourism Relief Fund; Hardest Hit Recovery Program
- Strategic positioning of the English and French language education sector, post-pandemic Canada's economic recovery, immigration, and labour force needs

2020 Annual Report on Language Education in Canada

- < 56% in student numbers;65,536 compared to 150,112 in2019
 - 65% drop in students from large eTA markets (Japan, Brazil, Mexio)
- < 49% in student weeks;
 768,022 compared to 1,511,081
 in 2019
- < 60% in workforce

- Incredible shift to virtual delivery; 59% of student weeks delivered online
- 50% of LC members relied on federal support programs to prevent closure
- Report demonstrates incredible ingenuity and resilience of the sector; only 11 program closures in first year of the pandemic





ANNOUNCING THE LOA VERIFICATION SYSTEM

Formal launch of the LOA Verification System later today!

- New system designed by LC for issuing and verifying Letters of Acceptance.
- Simple solution will be made available to CBSA and IRCC officers for instant validation of students' Letters of Acceptance at the time of applying for Study Permits and at the port of entry.





QUALITY ASSURANCE

- Proposed adjustments to the LC Standards
- New PTIB Designation Review Process (BC) Reduced cost and red tape for LC members

- Advocate for continued science-based easing of Canada's border restrictions to increase flow of international students into LC members' classrooms.
- Ensure eligibility of LC members for any postpandemic stimulus funding, particularly through programs that target Canada's Hardest Hit sectors.
- Position the language education sector as a valuable contributor in addressing Canada's labour force needs and immigration targets.

- Establish access to work for international language students through an experiential language learning model.
