

Challenging our own biases

Intercultural awareness training was not a thing

The profession has changed in requirements over the years.

More theoretical than practical.

Teacher training programs tend to lack intercultural effectiveness components!

Most intercultural competence is learned "on the job"

Intercultural training is often lacking. Needs to start with understanding of self and assumptions

More focus on adapting textbooks and supplements

Teacher training tended to be laser focused on theory.



How to adapt / supplement materials.

Creating opportunities for authentic learning

Learned how to be a better teacher through effective role models

Difficulties in dealing with cultural clashes between students

This topic requires ongoing training

No culture of continuous learning

Intentional learning is essential.

No instruction related to diversity or cultures. Focus on theory!

Hands on experience is important.



Doesn't teach conflict resolution strategies

We have to make our own pathway.

Include EAP

Traveling and working abroad don't guarantee intercultural learning

Almost no intercultural training

Culture isn't limited to nationality–students bring lots of intersecting identities into the classroom with them

More post-training direction needed-find some instructors think they're done once training end

Teacher training programs tend to be too short to cover theory, pedagogy and ICC.

Lack of Training on how to deal with the problems teachers might experience in the classroom



"old" teachers need to have their eyes opened, too!

Conflict-resolution skills should be taught

The value of observation

Dealing with mental health and cultural misunderstandings

Reflection

Mentorship/teacher buddy


