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A Little History



TOEFL® Program History

- Paper-based test (PBT) administered starting in 1963
- Computer-based test (CBT) introduced in 1998
 - Discontinued when the TOEFL iBT® test was introduced
- Internet-delivered test (TOEFL iBT) rolled out gradually around the world starting in 2005
- The revised *TOEFL*® Paper-delivered Test (rPdT) replaced the *TOEFL*® PBT test in Fall 2017

When Change is Good

ETS makes changes to its tests only after

- Listening to test takers and score users about their needs
- Doing research to ensure that the proposed changes won't affect the reliability, validity or fairness of the test

What needs prompted these changes?

- Making the test less stressful for test takers
- Improving the test registration site and process
- Providing more opportunities to take the test
- Using the benefits of technology to improve scoring
- Providing additional information to score users



Changes to the *TOEFL iBT* * Test Format and Scoring



Shorter Test

Starting August 1, 2019

- Testing time reduced by 30 minutes, to three hours
- Same overall test format and question types
- Fewer questions in the Reading and Listening sections
- Fewer tasks in the Speaking section
- No change to the score scale

Shorter Test – Specific Changes

Speaking (fewer tasks)	6 tasks 2 independent 4 integrated 20 minutes	4 tasks 1 independent 3 integrated 17 minutes
Writing (no change)	2 tasks 1 integrated 1 independent 50 minutes	2 tasks 1 integrated 1 independent 50 minutes



Does the Shorter Test Provide the Same Level of Quality?

Yes: Scores are still reliable.

- ETS researchers analyzed data from multiple 2018 *TOEFL iBT*® test administrations to compare the reliability of the longer and shorter versions
- The data showed that test reliability is maintained with the shortened test
- The shorter test maximizes measurement efficiency without sacrificing quality




Enhanced Speaking Scoring

Adding AI technology to provide the best in measurement

- ETS's *SpeechRater*SM service uses artificial intelligence (AI) technology to assess and provide feedback on pronunciation, fluency, vocabulary and grammar
- The combination of AI and human raters' evaluation of content, meaning and language use provides unmatched accuracy and reliability
- As of August 1, 2019, all TOEFL iBT® Speaking responses are rated by both a human rater and the SpeechRater service
 - Speaking section score now based on more ratings (8) than before (6)
 - 4 human ratings + 4 SpeechRater ratings
- No other major English proficiency test combines the benefits of AI and human scoring for speaking and writing





Instant Scoring of Reading and Listening

• Starting with the February 15, 2020 test, test takers will see their unofficial scores for Reading and Listening on-screen after they complete the test

- This early indication of performance can help test takers make well-informed decisions about:
 - Keeping or cancelling their scores, when given the option at the end of the test, or
 - Registering for another test without having to wait six days for official scores

Introducing *MyBest*™ Scores

Shows the test taker's best performance

- Score reports show the scores from a single test date and MyBest scores
- MyBest scores are the combination of the highest section scores from all valid test dates
- Automatically included in all score reports starting August 1, 2019



Why Add *MyBest™* Scores?

Universities prefer having them

- 74% of admissions officers surveyed prefer adding MyBest scores to score reports, compared to only receiving scores from a single test date*
- Having both sets of scores is seen by admissions officers as more useful than single test date scores alone*

Widen the pool of qualified applicants

• With *MyBest* scores, more students can meet an institution's score requirements when they show their best performance across all of their valid *TOEFL iBT*® tests

Are *MyBest™* Total Scores Valid?

Yes: They are built from valid section scores.

 All section scores from valid tests are valid, so the combination of highest scores is also valid

Yes: Independent studies confirm it.

• Studies in the testing field show that superscores are just as valid as other common scoring methods (e.g., most recent score, average score)

Yes: ETS research confirms it.

- An ETS study compared the MyBest scores and the most recent test date scores of all test takers who repeated the test within a recent 2-year period
- The research found that there is only a small average difference between the *MyBest* total score and the most recent total score (approximately 4 points)







MyBest™ Scores on Score Reports

Automatically included in all score reports

- All score reports sent after August 1, 2019, regardless of the **test administration date**, will include both *MyBest*™ scores and scores from a single test date
- Includes score reports in ETS® Data Manager, the Scorelink® service, server-to-server feeds, and paper score reports

How Do *MyBest*™ Scores Help Test Takers and Score Users?

- In this example, the test taker needs to achieve a total score of 80, with no section score lower than 18, to meet the requirements of University X
- The test taker meets University X's score requirement after two administrations:
 - Saving the test taker time and money by not having to take more tests
 - Providing University X with an additional applicant who meets its score requirements

Check University Requirements for *MyBest*™ Policies

ETS has recommended that institutions add *MyBest* information to their websites

Suggested language is:

- [INSTITUTION NAME] accepts *MyBest*[™] scores for the *TOEFL iBT*[®] test, in addition to TOEFL iBT scores from a single test date.
- [INSTITUTION NAME] only accepts *TOEFL iBT*® scores from a single test date, not *MyBest*™ scores.



Faster Score Reporting

Starting with the October 26, 2019 test:

- Test takers can view their scores online in approximately
 6 days instead of 10
- Institutions can view scores online in approximately 6 days instead of 13
- Test takers can download PDF score reports in 7–8 days
- Paper score reports are mailed from ETS to institutions in 9–11 days



More Opportunities to Test

Increased Capacity with Afternoon Testing

- Convenient afternoon sessions added to select test dates starting August 24, 2019
- Up to 12 afternoon sessions per year
- Doubles test date capacity at participating test centers



More Opportunities to Test

Reduced Retest Waiting Period

- Required waiting period between TOEFL iBT® tests reduced
 from 12 days to 3 days
- Allows testing on consecutive weekends, as available dates permit
- Helps meet urgent deadlines
- Test takers can still test as many times as they wish



More Opportunities to Test

Register online up to just 2 days before a test


- Starting December 16, 2019, test takers can register online up to just 2 days*
 before a test (formerly 4 days)
- Standard late fee still applies from 7 days before the test
- No changes to policies related to registration by phone or mail
- In China, deadline to reschedule or cancel a test is 4 days before the test (formerly 10 days)



^{*} Late registration officially ends worldwide at 11:59 pm, Eastern US time, 2 days before the test (for example, on Thursday for a Saturday test).


